CHURCH STREET LEISURE FACILITY COMING SOON!

A new leisure facility, as part of the Luton Street development, will shortly be opening to the community this summer.

The Church Street Community Leisure Centre will support a varied programme of sports and activities, whilst enhancing the health and quality of life for local people of all ages. The sports include 5-a-side Football, Volleyball, Futsal, Basketball and Badminton. There will also be a community room able to host a variety of events and classes ranging from yoga to pilates, community meetings, children's parties and soft play.

We have also designed the centre to be fully inclusive and to include a 'Changing Places' facility allowing

users with complex disabilities and their carers to fully access the facilities. Users will also have access to a consultation room for a Physical Activity Referral Scheme, whereby healthcare professionals can refer residents to receive a tailored exercise programme to help deal with long-term health conditions.

The facility will be run for the council by Everyone Active, which manages our leisure facilities across Westminster.

To ensure local residents can get active for less, accessible concessionary rates to Westminster residents will be available through an ActiveWestminster Card. We will provide further updates on the opening of the centre in our future newsletters.

THE COMMUNITY BIKE SHOP THAT'S TRANSFORMING LIVES

A community bike shop on Church Street, set up by Westminster City Council in partnership with Groundwork London and Cycle Confident, is providing opportunities for those most in need in Westminster.

The shop, called 'Westminster Wheels', is providing opportunities for out-of-work residents to train as bike mechanics and be paid the London Living Wage while they are learning.

Throughout the six-month programme, the trainees work alongside experienced bike mechanics refurbishing old bikes – of which 80% are sold at affordable prices to generate income for the shop, and 20% are donated to the local community.

One trainee currently at the shop is 22-year-old Shakeim who attended a taster day and then went on to complete his City & Guilds Level 1 in bike mechanics. "Working at Westminster Wheels has helped me learn how to fix bikes," he says. "It has also taught me customer service skills, teamwork and has increased my self-confidence".

THE WINDRUSH GENERATION: UNSUNG HEROES EXHIBITION

On Tuesday 22 June 1948, the HMT Empire Windrush docked at Tilbury Dock carrying more than 500 members of the Caribbean community, who were set to begin their new lives in the UK.

The Windrush Generation came to London between 1948 and 1970 by invitation from the British Government to rebuild a nation ravaged by war. The music, food and culture they brought forms a vital part of British culture today.

To celebrate the contributions made by the Windrush Generation, Westminster City Council is hosting an exhibition at **Queen's Park Library, 666 Harrow Road, W10**. **4NE until 15 August 2022.**
